## 6-8 SPEAKING PICTURE CHAT ASSESSMENT BEGINNING/EARLY INTERMEDIATE

The purpose of this assessment is to elicit student responses consistent with the Beginning and Early Intermediate Proficiency Levels. Students will view and discuss the photo.

**Begin** by allowing time for the student to view the photo.

Say, "I want you to look at all the people, places and things in this picture. In a minute we'll talk about it."
